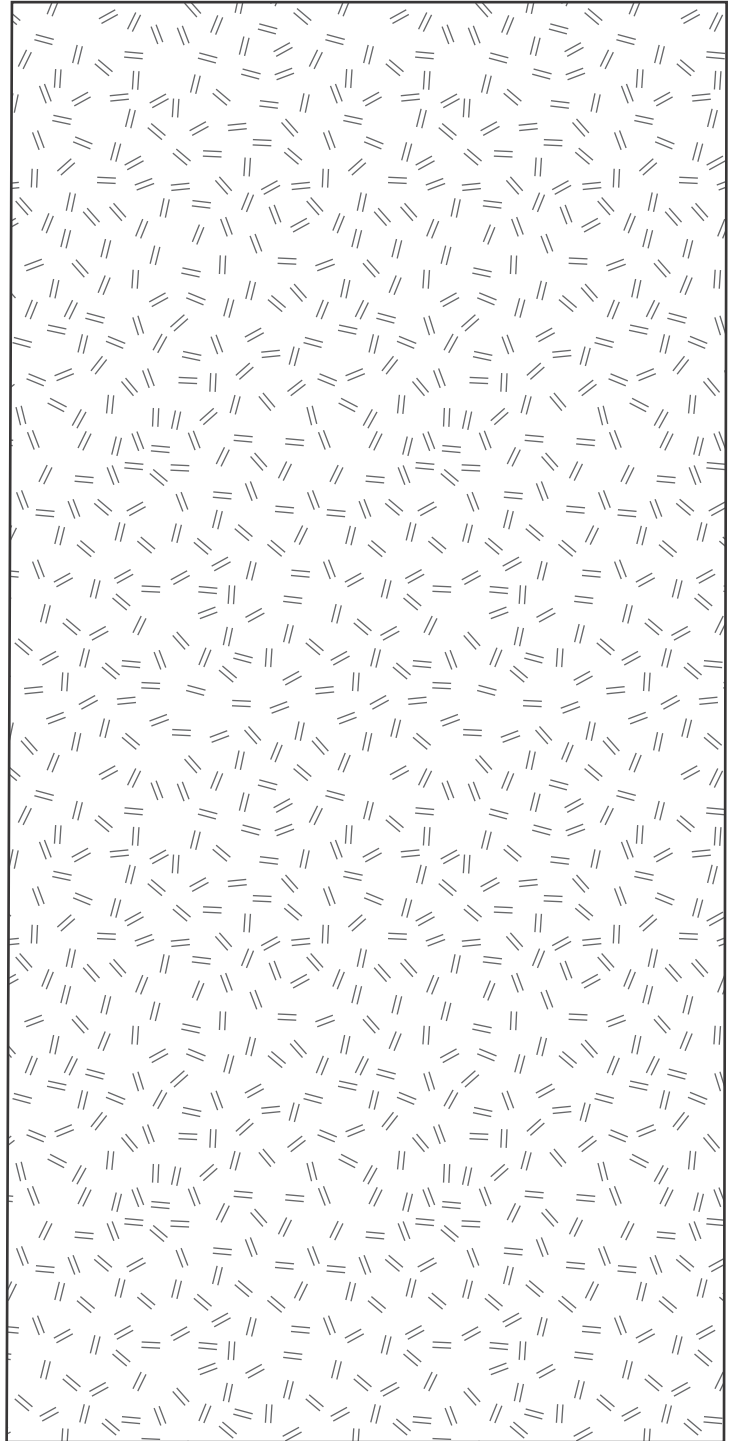
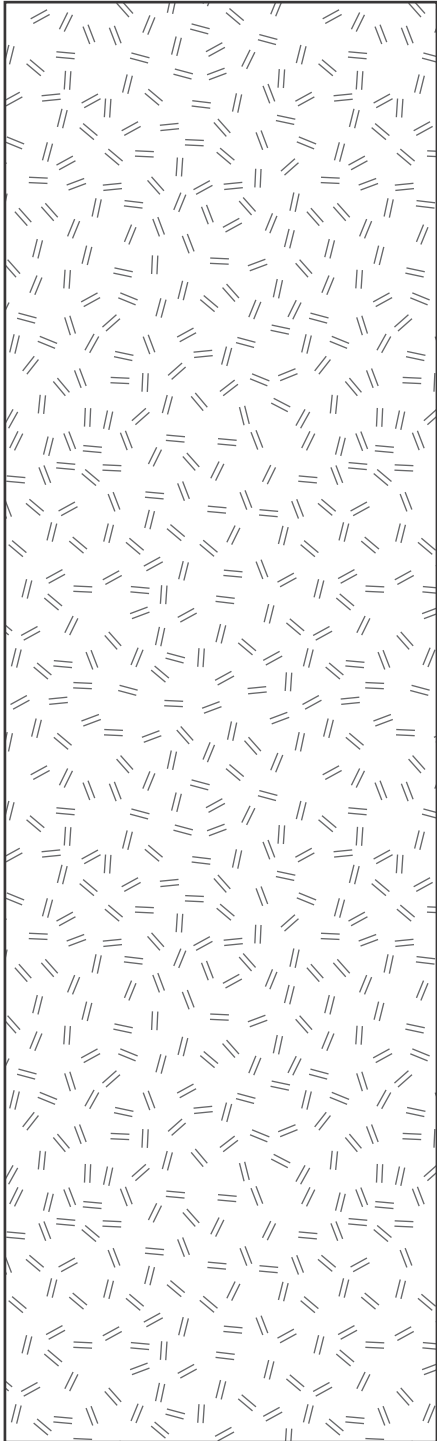



Play with a partner. Work together.

- 1** Player 1 rolls the number cube and the dot cube.  
- 2** Player 1 adds  and  and puts that many connecting cubes in a row on the mat. A row can only have 10 cubes. If cubes are left over, start a new row.
- 3** Player 2 rolls the number cube and  the dot cube. 
- 4** Player 2 adds  and  and puts that many connecting cubes in a row on the mat.
- 5** Each player records the total number of cubes on the mat.
- 6** The game is over when the mat is full.

- Play *Roll Tens 2*. Use one dot or number cube. Use equations to record. (Introduced in Session 3.2)

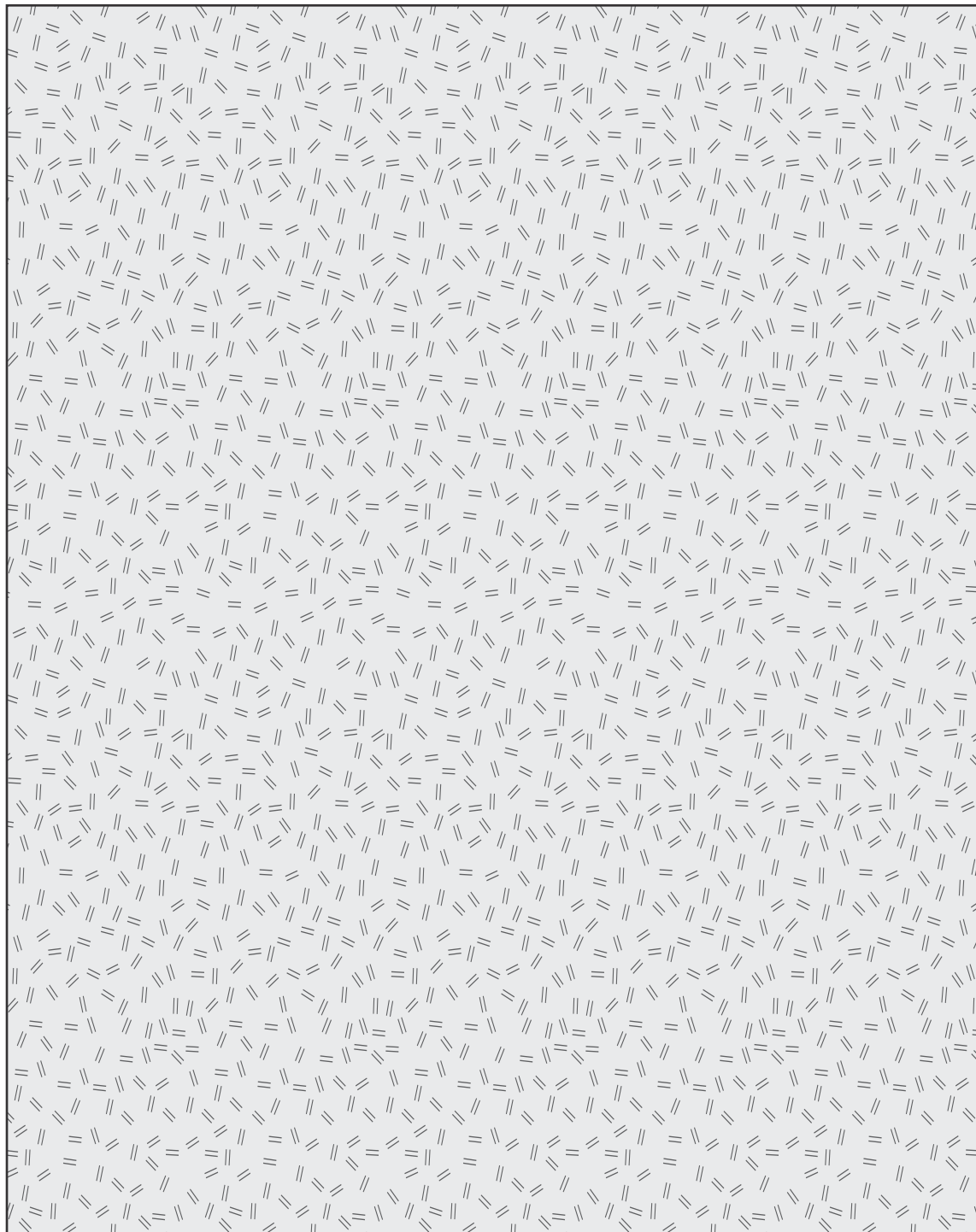
